- Much like other educational programs, choosing the right business program should ideally revolve around your [ultimate career goal](#). Once you have an idea of your desired career track, research specialties, such as accounting, entrepreneurship or finance that meet your needs.
- When applying to colleges and universities that have business programs, in both undergraduate and graduate admissions, Canadian applicants may need to pass an [English proficiency test](#) (exemptions can be granted). Graduate program applicants need to also take the [GMAT](#) or [GRE](#) test – [view example application requirements](#).
- Canadian students may qualify for certain merit scholarships. These qualification and availability largely depends on the specific school you are interested. For example, the [Cornell University business program](#) allows Canadian students to be eligible for merit scholarships based on academic achievements, test scores and community involvement.
