First, CUNY is the only institution to have public schools in Architecture (City College), Law, Journalism (Graduate School of Journalism) and Film. [Brooklyn College's Barry R. Feirstein Graduate School of Cinema](#) is the first public film school in New York City as well as the only film school in America to be built on a working film lot. Queens College is the only college that offers the Library Science Program in CUNY. The CUNY School of Law trains lawyers dedicated to working in public interest and is highly regarded for their clinical training.



The Graduate Center has many well renowned programs and offers several fellowships and incentives to help students complete their doctoral degrees. The CUNY School of Professional Studies offers online and on campus degree options for those students that need flexibility. CUNY institutions have been recognized for their programs in Business, Education, and Criminal Justice and continue to be leaders in these fields today.
