<u>Springfield College</u> is located in picturesque New England and is situated on the shores of Lake Massasoit in <u>Springfield</u>, <u>Massachusetts</u>. Centrally located to a variety of attractions, restaurants, and entertainment venues, there's always something to do. The College offers a range of undergraduate and graduate programs in <u>health</u> care, human services, social work, exercise science and sport studies, physical education, education, business, psychology and counseling, communications, computer technology, mathematics, science, social sciences, and the arts. It also offers doctoral programs in physical education, physical therapy, and counseling psychology.





Faculty members are recognized nationally and internationally as experts in their area of study, and they strive to help students achieve their academic and professional goals. A <u>post-graduation survey</u> found that 96 percent of 2015-16 Springfield College bachelor degree recipients were either employed or enrolled in graduate school within six months of graduation. The College's placement rate is 12 percent higher than the national average for similar schools and, on average, higher than other colleges and universities in New England.

A <u>top-ranked college</u>, Springfield College is the best destination for those seeking a well-rounded education, strong academics, and experiential learning opportunities. Outside of the classroom, students spend their time leading <u>service projects</u>, exploring the world through <u>study abroad opportunities</u>, taking advantage of campus <u>clubs and organizations</u>, and getting involved with the institution's <u>26 NCAA Division III athletics teams</u>.
