


EducationUSA Canada Spotlights John Hopkins University

John Hopkins University is a place where ambitious, talented, and creative students thrive. Since the university's start in 1876, students in all majors have embraced a spirit of learning through exploration and discovery. As the first research institution in the United States, John Hopkins offers unparalleled resources and connections. The vast John Hopkins network includes schools, centers, and affiliates throughout Baltimore, as well as in the Washington D.C. area, and throughout the world, including campuses in Bologna, Italy and Nanjing, China.



The Homewood campus in <u>Central Baltimore</u> is home base for about 5,300 Hopkins undergraduates. With academic flexibility and over 60% of undergraduates pursuing a double major or minor, students are able to build the academic path that is right for them. <u>Academic</u> and <u>pre-professional</u> advisers along with accessible faculty and supportive staff guide students throughout their time on campus and after they graduate.



More than 75% of undergrads do research of some kind, and many receive support through awards and programs dedicated to <u>funding</u> <u>undergraduate research</u>. Students also take advantage of <u>hands-on learning</u>, <u>study abroad</u> <u>programs</u>, and <u>advanced graduate study that reflect the school's <u>spirit of academic exploration</u>. With access to opportunities typically reserved for graduate students and working professionals, Hopkins students are publishing papers, presenting at conferences, and contributing to the academic landscapes as early as their first year.</u>
