California State University, Monterey Bay

Founded in 1994, California State University, Monterey Bay (CSUMB) is one of the 23 campuses of the California State University system. It is centrally located on California's coastline, just hours away from San Francisco, Silicon Valley, Yosemite National Park, and Los Angeles. Monterey Bay is one of the largest marine protected areas in the world and home to whales, deep sea anglerfish, and of course the university's mascot, sea otters.



The close proximity from the ocean gives students the opportunity to receive hands on lab and field experience by researching deep sea life and environmental issues. The prime location gives students access to the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary, Big Sur mountains and coastline, Elkhorn Slough National Estuarine Reserve, and Salinas Valley agriculture, the "salad bowl of the world". Not only is CSUMB in a biologically-rich destination, it is also near Silicon Valley, where students can collaborate with pioneering tech companies.


