

EducationUSA Canada continues to engage the public actively through virtual platforms. Webinars and spotlights as well as a newsletter to students are great ways to promote educational opportunities for Canadians in the U.S.

Canadian higher education institutions continue to think more strategically about more sustainable pathways for mobility through institutional linkages. Consortium-like working groups are being supported in these efforts such as the Ontario Academic Exchanges working group.

- Pre-high school (# of years): 9 years (10 for Alberta)
- High school (# of years): 4 years (3 for Alberta)

- Standardized undergraduate admissions testing availability in-country and adviser recommendations: Highly available in country, with availability to travel to USA if needed.
- Standardized undergraduate admissions test mean scores (as of 2017): TOEFL: 95. SAT: N/A. ACT: N/A.

Structure of University System

- Years of study required to earn a bachelor's degree: 4 years
- Language of instruction in universities: Primarily English, several French or bilingual universities
- Years of required English instruction in universities: Varies by university
- Grading system and interpretation: Varies by university
- Degrees offered: College diploma (like an AA), Bachelor's, Master's, PhD, professional degrees
- Top fields of study/majors: Unknown/ Not reported
- Standardized graduate admissions testing availability / frequency offered in-country: Highly available in country in major cities
- Standardized graduate admissions test mean scores (as of 2017) GRE: Verbal reasoning-156, Quantitative reasoning-154.6, Analytical Writing-4.2. GMAT: 574. TOEFL: 95.
- **Study Abroad:** Highly available, however only 2.3% of undergrads study abroad annually, Canada is trying to expand these programs, funding available for U.S. travel through Killam Fellowship)
