ADMISSIONS TIMELINE

Step 3	: Complete your Applications		
Spring-	Summer (at least one year prior to enrollment)		
	Study for and take admissions tests		
	Reach out to potential faculty supervisors (thesis programs)		
August	-September		
	Finalize your list of universities		
	Open and work on applications		
	Work closely with a mentor and EducationUSA adviser		
	Ask recommenders to write letters		
	Work on your essays/statements/writing sample		
	Take or retake admissions tests		
Fall-Early Winter			
	Check admissions deadlines, they very widely by program and university		
	Apply for all university-based financial aid opportunities		
February-May			
	Receive admissions decisions with financial aid offered		
April-J	une		
	Select your university and place deposit		
	Begin working directly with your school, department, or supervisor		
July			
	Secure off-campus housing, sign lease
